

EXAMPLE SEARCH: FINDING MIDUS ARTICLES BY TOPIC & YEAR

Consider that you want to do a search within the “Biomarkers” topic category and further that you want to restrict the time period to 2016-2019. Here is how such a search can be conducted:

1. Go to: <http://www.midus.wisc.edu/findings/index.php>






